As I reflect on another transformative year for the Louisville Youth Philanthropy Council, I am filled with immense pride in what our young leaders have accomplished, and deep gratitude for the community that continues to support their journey. This year, 48 high school students from across Jefferson and Shelby Counties participated in our signature program, engaging in rigorous nonprofit evaluation processes, conducting site visits, and ultimately directing \$22,500 in grants to local organizations addressing critical community needs. Beyond grantmaking, our participants developed essential leadership competencies through workshops on public speaking, financial literacy, the world of philanthropy, and nonprofit governance.

The ripple effects of our work extend far beyond the grants awarded, as our teen philanthropists have emerged as genuine changemakers who understand their responsibility to contribute to the common good. Many of our alums have gone on to serve on nonprofit boards, start social ventures, or pursue careers in the nonprofit sector, proving that we are cultivating not just informed donors, but engaged citizens who will lead Louisville – and the world – for decades to come. The resulting waves will be endless!

None of this work would be possible without our incredible network of supporters—founding members, corporate sponsors, nonprofit partners, individual donors, dedicated staff, and volunteer mentors who believe in the power of young people to create positive change. To our remarkable participants and alumni: you inspire us daily with your passion, intelligence, and commitment to making Louisville a more just and compassionate community for all. As we celebrate another successful year, we recommit ourselves to developing young philanthropists who will carry forward Louisville's tradition of community engagement and social responsibility, building a stronger, more equitable future for our city. Letter from the Executive Director

This year, we embraced the theme "Waves of Impact" to highlight how the work of LYPC students ripples far beyond the classroom and the grant. Their decisions create change that touches lives across our community: humane action starter kits distributed through The Arrow Fund, a welcoming teen room at Cabbage Patch that will be used for years to come, upgrades to the Child Enrichment Center at the Center for Women and Families that strengthen therapeutic and developmental care, and expanded educational resources through Boys & Girls Club's Power Hour. Each of these investments reaches hundreds of people across Kentucky. This is the power of youth philanthropy.

But the waves aren't just felt in the community—they are within our students themselves. When young people dedicate time to learning, questioning, and caring about the issues that shape our world, they build the foundation for a lifetime of giving and leadership. We see it again and again in our alumni—like Mackenzie Berry, who founded Young Poets of Louisville, and Henry Clan, who carried the spirit of giving as his fraternity's Philanthropy Chair. As one student, Sydney Bright, said so powerfully: "I am going to change the world, and the Louisville Youth Philanthropy Council is the first step." LYPC is where those first waves begin.

This year, we made waves bigger than ever before. We welcomed our largest class to date with 48 students—30 returning and 33 seniors—and increased team grants to \$7,500, allowing student investments to stretch even further. We deepened collaborations with local organizations and companies, expanding students' understanding of the nonprofit world. And we launched a new cohort program, inspired by a current student, that gives third-year participants the chance to dive even deeper into the practice of philanthropy.

For 13 years, I have had the honor of witnessing the ripple effects of LYPC students' work. Each wave carries hope, inspiration, and transformation. I am profoundly proud of what we accomplished this year and deeply grateful for what lies ahead. Together, we are building waves of impact that will shape communities for generations to come.

Program Services


- For the fourth year in a row, LYPC students participated in a full-day job shadowing event with Brown Forman Foundation and Corporate Giving representatives.





Celebrating the Waves Ahead








2024-2025 LYPC FINANCIALS



For the seventh year, LYPC and the University of Louisville School of Business partnered to provide LYPC students with the potential for three hours of college credit through LYPC participation plus additional course work.
